Sawara Float events used to be held as sub-festivals during each local deity festival. Each town would courageously - and sometimes solemnly - pull around extravagant floats decorated with giant effigies of people and other images accompanied by the music of Sawara musicians.

Lotus Festival

Hasu-matsuri

Cultivated over 300 varieties of lotus flowers and it boasts the largest scale in Japan. You can also see some extremely rare flowers, including the Oga lotus, which sprouts out of seeds from 2,000 years ago, and the senbenren lotus, which has more than one thousand petals. Please be sure to see the best lotus blossoms in Japan.

A total of 1,500,000 irises - in 400 different varieties - turn the entire area into a carpet of purple. In addition, Suigo Sawara Ayame Park is the only one of the numerous iris gardens all across the country where you can view the flowers from a water channel that passes through the garden while riding in a boat called a sappabune. Please enjoy the outstandingly beautiful irises along with the refreshing early summer breeze blowing across the water.










AYAME PARK

Suigo Sawara Ayame Park is located in Suigo-Tsukuba National Park. At this nearly 8-hectare park, which contains an island, bridge and water, you can enjoy a nostalgic riverside atmosphere.

During the Iris-Festival, a total of 1.500,000 irises - in 400 different varieties. including Edo, Higo and Ise types - are in bloom, and a various events are held, such as boat rides by new brides and touring boats of Sawara musicians. In addition, the Lotus-Festival is held from July to August, and you can view more than 300 different types of lotus flowers.



Lotus gallery

300 different varieties of lotuses are cultivated in Ayame Park. The hottest period of the summer is when the most beautiful flowers bloom. There are also some very rare, valuable varieties cultivated in here, such as chodairen, which looks like a flower blooming inside the flower, and taiseikin, double-flowered lotus.
